Positive Outcomes from Crime

The robbery occurred on Sunday 20th April on Hinckley Road, which was a business vehicle that was driven from the scene and left on Beggars Lane near to Mallard Way. A suspect has been identified for two thefts from stores and attempts to locate the individual are underway with another person arrested and charged for another unrelated theft from a store offence.

One person was arrested for theft of a motor vehicle in Glenfield and issued with a caution.

Suspects have been identified and enquiries are continuing in relation to the theft of some garden plants that have been an issue in Glenfield last year. Please keep an eye out overnight for any suspicious activity and report it to the police immediately.

There was an incident of road rage on the A50 in Glenfield where a person has been arrested and charged with a Public Order offence.

Emerging Crime Trends

Burglary other than dwellings in Glenfield have mostly been targeting bicycles. If you have bicycles in your sheds or garage please lock them up as well as locking the shed/garage itself. It is advised that you get alarms fitted to your outbuildings to increase the security of them. Lawn mowers and other garden equipment have also been targeted.

We have not taken any reports of theft of vehicle parts in April, however, Satellite Navigation Systems and other items left on show in vehicles have been targeted. You can prevent yourself being a victim of this type of crime by simply removing all items from your vehicle when you go inside your address.

<u>ASB</u>

There have been some issues with people playing golf around the Pavilion in Leicester Forest East. Individuals have been identified and spoken to by police in relation to this matter and patrols to ensure that no further issues at the location arise.

We have taken reports of vehicles parking up on the car park of Millennium Green and taking drugs. We have conducted patrols and attended incidents called in by local residents and spoken with the vehicle occupants, however, so far no evidence of drug taking has been found by the Police over the last month.

A male has been reported to be begging around One Stop in Kirby Muxloe. know this individual and are making efforts to locate him to speak with him.

The Premier Store on Forest House Lane in Leicester Forest East is having some issues with youths acting anti socially around the location. The beat team have identified several individuals who have been advised and the location is now subject to an operation which will see officers visit more frequently in an attempt to deal with any antisocial behavior occurring at the location.

Residents of Lancelot Close in Leicester Forest East have complained about people knocking on their doors and windows and then running away. The local beat team are currently attempting to locate suspects so that they can be dealt with.

Issues highlighted to police over the month

There have been two separate incidents around Faire Road and on Kirby Road in Glenfield of a male exposing himself. No suspects have been identified at this time.

Warrants Executed

A drugs warrant was executed in Leicester Forest East where a cannabis factory was located. One person was arrested and charged with production of cannabis with another person from the address being charged with possession.

Beat Initiatives

The beat team have been working through a variety of tactics to combat theft from vehicles and burglaries as a part of the Problem Solving Plans.

We are in the process of sending out letters to the owners of vehicle types that have been targeted in relation to hub caps. The beat team will be available on Saturday 17th May on Wheatfield Close in Glenfield to come to for crime prevention advice and will have lots of information leaflets and crime prevention items to show to members of the public.
