



POLICE REPORT – FEBRUARY 2017

In February we received **250 calls** from members of the public relating to incidents across the three parishes.

Crime Alert

Last months figures for burglaries have improved and halved across the beat with 2 in LFE, none in Kirby Muxloe and 4 in Glenfield. The offences in Glenfield still appear to be near the New Parks boundary and that surrounding area. We continue to target burglary as a priority with the hope that this continues to decrease.

There were slightly higher reports of car crime with 5 in Glenfield, 5 across LFE and 3 in Kirby Muxloe. For some areas this has increased, and we continue to put across the message for residents to ensure they are securing their vehicles and not leaving valuables on show.

We have also had reports of rogue trading around Glenfield which has fortunately been dealt with now, however we do request locals keep an eye for their elderly/ vulnerable neighbours and report anything of note to us.

Anti-Social Behaviour

Speeding enforcement patrols have been carried out on Forest House Lane during February, around 5 people were spoken to and local residents also engaged with during this time. In regards to ASB in Glenfield we have had numerous phone calls in relation to bikes being driven antisocially. Consultations have been planned for this month to establish how wide spread this is and action will then be taken.
