Glenfield Newsletter – January 2012

December has seen a small but positive reduction in the number of reported burglaries. Out of the four one was an attempt on Sports Road whereby the beading on a ground floor window was removed, however no entry was gained. The second was a vacant house on Stelle Way. The property had been left in darkness for several weeks and the offenders have removed a window to gain entry. The third is a house on Gynsill Lane. It is believed that intruder(s) have gained access via the sports pavilion and smashed a pane of glass in the rear door. The property had an alarm system but this was not set. The fourth happened during a New Years party where entry was by the unlocked front door. Only keys were stolen and then used to enter victim's place of work.

The assaults which have been reported include two which were domestic related and the remaining involved persons either at special schools or assisted living accommodation. No person was significantly injured during the incidents.

The theft from motor vehicle figure includes an unlocked car on Hayfield Close having its glove box searched overnight but nothing taken and a car parked on Leicester Road had a window smashed during daylight hours and high valued electrical items taken.

Criminal damage reports vary from a fence panel being kicked to a fork lift at the Co-op having its ignition barrel removed. There appears to be no link between the reports or one individual being targeted. The majority of reports are late evening/overnight which suggests the involvement of alcohol and a large portion of stupidity.
