Positive Outcomes from Crime

A male has been arrested and charged with Theft of Motor Vehicle Leicester Forest East.

A prolific offender of Theft Stores was re-arrested for Shop Theft and has been charged with a further 15 offences. He has been sentenced to prison. Suspects have been identified for a Burglary Dwelling in Glenfield, enquires continue.

It would appear from July's crime stats that Burglary Dwelling and Other than Dwelling offences have decreased, this is a great positive step.

Emerging Crime Trends

There has been an increase in Criminal Damage around Leicester Forest East over the past month where an "LE3" has been scratch into vehicles. Please be vigilant overnight for any persons that may be hanging around or passing by and causing damage to vehicles near to your property and report any suspicious behavior immediately. These incidents have been sporadic with no pattern. The beat team have been engaging with the community to ascertain who may be responsible. Any information would be greatly received.

Theft from Motor Vehicles again still seems to be an issue on this beat, with the majority still being insecure. Please ensure that all property is taken from your vehicles and not left on display for opportunistic offenders. The beat team, along with additional officers will be conducting extra evening patrols in Glenfield and LFE over the next month to try and combat this issue.



<u>ASB</u>

There were 18 reported ASB incidents over the course of July, this was only 3 more incidents than June which is a really positive result as we would normally see a spike over the start of the school holidays. Of those 18, again many are isolated incidents however, there have been repeated issues in some areas which we are dealing with.

There has been a report of various reports around Kirby Lane, Kirby Muxloe of Antisocial Behavior. The core issues surrounding this have been explained to those involved and action has been taken by the Police and Blaby district Council to try and resolve these issues. So far, the location has settled down and reports of antisocial behavior have decreased considerably.

People kicking footballs around the Premier Convenience store on Forest House Lane has been highlight, though it is pleasing to note that this is not a problem that is persistent or as regularly reported previously.

Lancelot Close in Leicester Forest East has had an issue with youths causing issues around the location for a couple of months. This remains an issue for the beat team who have been working toward reducing the behavior here. This has recently resulted in the arrest of three individuals for Public Order Offences. Enquiries are ongoing in relation to the issues around this location.
