Welcome to the October edition of the Glenfield newsletter.

Crime Update

In the past month, vehicles with items of property left on display, such as Sat-Navs and laptop computers have been broken into.

Most of the burglary dwelling offences occurred in the first half of the month. Three people were arrested in connection with one of the burglaries, two of them later being charged and sent to court. This is all thanks to a helpful member of the public who phoned the Police to report the suspicious persons, with Police detaining the suspects a short time later. Since then, we are pleased to see that there have been only two further burglaries in the village.

The majority of the criminal damage offences are part of a continuing series in the village running along The Balk and onto Glenfield Frith Drive, as previously reported. To combat this problem, extra officers have been brought in, some in plain clothes, to disrupt and deter the persons responsible. Enquiries are ongoing but the last reported offences were 5th September.
